How I Spent My Last Week of Summer Vacation by Francis J. Kalvoda.

The weekend before I had to go back to school (my 34th year of teaching mathematics at Willmar Senior High School), I attended the Central National Lincoln Continental Owners Club Meet at Red Wing, Minnesota. I just recently joined the National Lincoln Club but have been a member of the Minnesota Northstar Chapter for a couple years.

This was my first Lincoln meet ever and my sister Anna and I took the 26,000 mile Lincoln Town

Coupe which my mother and I ordered and purchased new in 1977. I spent a few days cleaning and polishing every nook and cranny of the Cordovan and White Coupe. The two tone leather interior, engine compartment, trunk, wheels, chrome, glass, and body all received my

best efforts.

After driving through 100 miles of haze and mist and about 50 more miles of rain, we arrived at Treasure Island Casino just in time for the 1 pm shopping bus to Red Wing. Anna took the bus and I started cleaning - again. I pulled in between two other Continentals, a diamond blue '79 Town Coupe and a midnight blue '79

Town Car. In talking to the owners, I found that I had the high miler of the trio. The '79 Coupe had 16k miles and the '79 4 door had 23k. David Saxan of Toledo, Ohio, the owner of the 4 door was extremely helpful as a long time Lincoln Club member and he had owned his car since new also. Since his car had won first place he would be judged in the Senior class while I would be judged in the Primary class. His beautiful 4 door had been judged as *high* as 99.5 points out of 100--I was impressed! He said the judges might question my glass top Coupe as he had never seen one. I showed him a letter I

received in 1981 from the American Sun-roof Corporation. Of the 95,600 1977 Continentals produced, 1347 two door Continentals received the larger version of the fixed

glass moon roof and 1591 4 door Continentals had the

smaller fixed glass moon roof. I also had a copy of the window sticker for my car which shows the \$960 option for the fixed glass moon roof.

The morning of judgment day (concoors) was very foggy and the heavy dew needed to be wiped off before the photo session of each car. Over 100 Lincolns from 1927 to 1992. I had never seen so many beautiful vintage Lincolns in one place. Many cars came out of the comfort of their trailers for the photos and the judging which began at 10 am. My car was judged at 2:30 pm. Every item on the car is inspected for authenticity, function and performance; interior, exterior, drive train, engine compartment, trunk; everything is to look and perform as it did when the car came off the assembly line.
